Are these international negotiations balanced and equitable even though it is clear that the nations involved dissimilar in terms of economic wealth, social, labor, and environmental standards; not to mention the differences in technology, infrastructure, and communications.

It is of concern to know that these negotiations are done without the input of citizens from here and abroad who are the ones that at the end are impacted by these agreements. These are the people that do not get the pleasure of experiencing the fruits of these trade agreements in terms of seeing their personal income and savings accounts grow; however they are the people that are impacted by job loss, dismemberment of communities, and democratic disempowerment. The common people of Maine, Colombia, Ecuador, and Perú have not been informed about this trade agreement and have not been invited to participate in the process. Who is holding the negotiators on all these countries accountable? Who are they accountable to? Why are citizens informed only after the negotiations have been completed? Why is this process done behind closed doors even though it is affecting the lives of millions of people across borders?
